GOVERNOR SIGNED Modifies the reporting requirement regarding jail reimbursements for housing state inmates by transferring responsibility for the report from the Department of Corrections to the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice (CCJJ). Requires the CCJJ to report to the Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Interim Committee by November 1 annually regarding jail reimbursements for housing state inmates. Requires the report to include: the number of state parole inmates housed by each county; and the number of state probationary inmates housed by each county. [FN: Will not directly or measurably impact state revenues or expenditures.]

Amends the penalty for violating the motor vehicle visible emissions limits (SUBSTITUTE removes the class B and enhances fines from \$50 to \$100 for second and subsequent offenses). [FN: First-time and second-time violators of the the offense outlined in this bill will be subject to fine of \$40 and possibly \$100 respectively.]

GOVERNOR SIGNED AMENDED This 149 page bill modifies the Insurance Code. The sanctions (lines 2586 through 2600) includes two new third-degree felonies: "whenever it appears to the commissioner that an insurer or any director, officer, employee, or agent of the insurer has committed a willful violation of this chapter, the commissioner may cause criminal proceedings to be instituted by the Third District Court of Salt Lake County..... An individual who willfully violates this chapter may be fined in the individual's individual capacity not more than \$100,000 notwithstanding Section 31A-2-308 and is guilty of a third degree felony." [FN: Would reduce annual transfers from the Captive Insurance Restricted Account (CIRA) to the Gen Fund by \$600,000 annually beginning FY18. There will be a corresponding increase in the balance of the CIRA subject to appropriations by the Legislature which may be used to cover projected cost increases in the program.]

GOVERNOR SIGNED AMENDED, added coordination clause. Authorizes the Driver License Division to disclose portions of a driving record to: an employer or a designee of an employer, for purposes of monitoring the driving record and status of current employees who drive as a responsibility of the employees' employment, if the requester demonstrates that the requester has obtained the written consent of the individual to whom the information pertains; and an employer or the employer's agents to obtain or verify information relating to a holder of a commercial driver license that is required under federal law. Requires that the authorized disclosure of a driving record be limited to the driving record of a current employee of the employer. Amends provisions regarding the content of and requirements for disclosing a commercial driver license motor vehicle record. [FN: Could increase state revenue to the Department of Public Safety Restricted Account by \$18,200 annually beginning FY 2016. could cost the DPS \$8,500 one-time in FY 2016 from the DPS Restricted Account for programming changes. Participating employers could pay \$31,800 annually beginning FY 2016 for records monitoring and detail reports, of which \$18,200 would be deposited with the state and \$13,600 would be paid to the information technology provider.]

AMENDED Provides and amends definitions. Amends the prohibition on using a handheld wireless communication device. Amends the exceptions to the prohibition on using a handheld wireless device. [FN: Could increase the amount the state will collect per applicable citation from \$100 to \$120. Surcharge revenue could also increase. There were 1,394 similar convictions in the most recent fiscal year (34 at the state level and 1,360 at the local Justice Court level). Assuming the same number of convictions, state revenue could increase by \$10,100 annually beginning FY 2016 from increased fine and surcharge collections. Local governments could collect up to \$27,500 in additional revenue annually beginning in FY 2016. The amount individuals will pay per citation could increase from \$100 to \$120. Applicable surcharges would also increase. About 1,400 convicted individuals could pay a total of \$37,600 more annually (\$10,100 more in state revenue and \$27,500 in revenue for local governments) beginning FY 2016.]

AMENDED Requires certain people to protect student privacy. Allows a student or the student's parent to authorize the collection and release of certain student data. Prohibits an education entity from releasing a student's personally identifiable information under certain circumstances. Allows an education entity to release a student's personally identifiable information under certain circumstances. Prohibits a school district from eliciting certain information from students. Provides what kinds of student data may be collected and under what circumstances. Requires an education entity to provide a student data disclosure to parents and students at the beginning of each school year or at the time a student enrolls with the education entity. Establishes requirements for the State Board of Education related to the collection, usage, and storage of student data. Allows an education entity to create and maintain certain student disciplinary records in accordance with rules made by the State Board of Education. Allows a student to request certain student data to be expunged or permanently destroyed. Requires the State Board of Education to designate a student privacy coordinator to oversee the protection of student data. Requires an education entity or third party contractor to collect, use, and store data in accordance with certain security measures. Establishes penalties (An individual who knowingly or intentionally permits unauthorized release or use of student data may be found guilty of a class A misdemeanor.) [FN: May cost the Utah State Office of Education \$758,000 ongoing beginning in FY2016 and \$275,100 one-time in FY 2016 from the Education Fund for expunging data, training, training materials, support staff, equipment, and third party audits. May cost local education agencies (LEAs) between \$1.1 million and \$1.5 million one-time in FY 2016 for training as outlined in the bill.]

GOVERNOR SIGNED Requires the State Board of Education to develop a funding proposal and make recommendations to the Legislature on how the State Board of Education and the Legislature can update student privacy laws in statute and in board rule. Requires the State Board of Education to designate a chief privacy officer. Requires the State Board of Education and the chief privacy officer to report to the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee. [FN: Appropriates \$180,000 ongoing and \$5,000 one-time from the Education Fund in FY 2016 for the State Office of Education to develop a student privacy funding proposal.]

GOVERNOR SIGNED AMENDED Amends the definition of "without consent of the victim" regarding sexual offenses in the following provisions: when the defendant knows the victim is unconscious or unaware, the provision requiring proof that the victim has not consented is removed; and when the defendant knows that the victim is incapable of understanding or resisting the offense, THE CAUSE of the incapacity includes any other reason, in addition to the current reasons of mental disease or defect. GOVERNOR SIGNED AMENDED Amends the provision that provides that a state or local law enforcement officer may only enforce the safety belt restraint requirement as a secondary action in certain circumstances to only apply beginning on a specified date (7/1/2018). Provides that until a specified date, a peace officer may not issue a citation to an individual for a violation if the person has not previously been warned for a violation but shall issue the individual a warning. Amends the requirements for the court to waive the fine for a safety belt violation. [FN: Could increase the number of violators and applicable fines. The state could collect between \$30 and \$45 per applicable citation. State revenue to the General Fund could increase by \$3,600 annually beginning FY 2016. Increased revenue to local governments could amount to \$23,600 annually beginning in FY 2016. Could increase the amount of violators and applicable citation fines and surcharges. About 1,800 convicted individuals could pay a total of \$27,000 more annually (\$3,400 in state revenue and \$27,600 in local government revenue) beginning FY 2016.]

This bill changes the legal smoking age to 21 from age 19. Prohibits the possession of tobacco, e-cigarettes, or paraphernalia by an individual less than 21 years of age. Prohibits the distribution or sale of tobacco, e-cigarettes, or paraphernalia to an individual less than 21 years of age. Prohibits a person less than 21 years of age from being present at certain establishments where tobacco, e-cigarettes, or paraphernalia are sold or used. Prohibits a proprietor of a business from allowing an individual less than 21 years of age to frequent the business while the individual is using tobacco. Addresses the investigation and enforcement of the provisions of this bill. [FN: May reduce tax revenue to the Gen Fund by about \$3,160,700 in FY 2016 and \$3,042,200 in FY 2017 due to decreased tobacco and related product sales. May reduce sales tax revenue to local governments by about \$202,100 in FY2016 and \$195,300 in FY 2017. Approximately 5,300 individuals could forgo paying tax on tobacco and related products for a tax savings of about \$635/person/year or about \$3.24 million to \$3.36 million total.]

Prohibits the tattooing of persons younger than 14 years of age. Provides that a minor 14 years of age or older may obtain a tattoo, but only if the minor's parent or guardian executes a written authorization prior to the tattooing and in the presence of the person who is to perform the tattooing. Exempts tattoos performed for medical purpose. Establishes a civil cause of action for recovery of the costs of removal of a tattoo performed unlawfully on a minor in violation of these provisions.

Imposes requirements related to querying the database to determine ineligibility to receive a deferred deposit loan. Imposes requirements related to the commissioner's annual report. Establishes what constitutes ineligibility to obtain a deferred deposit loan. Creates the Deferred Deposit Lending Database Program, which includes the creation of the Deferred Deposit Lending Database. Permits the department to contract with a third party to establish and maintain the database. Addresses various requirements related to the operation of the database. Grants rulemaking authority. Provides for the process to make a query to the database, including the payment of a fee.
