Agenda Item:	INFORMATIONAL ITEMS – CAMILLE ANTHONY
Notes:	<p>Camille provided an update to the Commission on the following items:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. At tomorrow’s Interim Meeting, Ron will present the Interstate Compact legislation and the Sex Offender Registration. The Sex Offender Registration information will bring Utah into compliance with Jacob Wetterling. 2. As discussed at the Annual Meeting, an RFP has been issued for a public relations person. 3. A press release was distributed to the Commission regarding the position the Commission is taking on Initiative B. In addition, USAAV voted to discussing this issue and will likely post an alternative to Initiative B on CCJJ’s web page. 4. Federal Budget status; still operating under third continuing resolution to keep federal government going. Three appropriation bills are left. Byrne and grant funding is still pending. The appropriation for the mini crime bill, which VOWA was attached, passed, as well as Amy’s Law.

Bill Evans reported for the Attorney General’s office. Camille Anthony reported for the Governor’s Office. Camille Anthony reported that she met with Robyn Arnold Williams and discussed items for Human Services. <p>Dave Walsh reported that an error occurred last legislative session in the compensation packages for the courts, Youth Corrections, Board of Pardons, and the Department of Corrections. Therefore, intent language has been added to request supplement money to cover the benefits package error.</p>
